



Zoinomics COVID- 19 Home Assessment Procedure

Prior to the assessment:

Client to complete pre assessment questionnaire which will include the following questions:

- Are you or anyone in your house clinically vulnerable?

This includes:

- Aged 70 or older (regardless of medical conditions)
- Under 70 with an underlying health condition listed below (that is, anyone instructed to get a flu jab each year on medical grounds):
 - Chronic (long-term) mild to moderate respiratory diseases, such as asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), emphysema or bronchitis
 - Chronic heart disease, such as heart failure
 - Chronic kidney disease
 - Chronic liver disease, such as hepatitis
 - Chronic neurological conditions, such as Parkinson's disease, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis (MS), or cerebral palsy
 - Diabetes
 - A weakened immune system as the result of certain conditions or medicines they are taking (such as steroid tablets)
 - Being seriously overweight (a body mass index (BMI) of 40 or above)
 - Pregnant women
- Have you or anyone in your household experienced such symptoms as, a new continuous cough, high temperature or loss of taste or smell in the past 14 days?

If the answer is 'Yes' to any of the above, the assessment will be postponed until advised that it safe to do so.

If the answer is 'No' to all of the above, a time and date will be agreed and confirmed via email. If the client needs to cancel an assessment due to developing symptoms, they should contact Zoinomics as soon as possible.

On the day:

The assessor will arrive to the assessment with appropriate Personal Protective Equipment, including:

- Face Mask
- Face Shield
- Disposable gloves
- Antibacterial wipes
- Hand sanitiser

Face mask and gloves will be worn as a standard.

Items brought into the home, including note books and tape measures will be wiped with alcohol prior to entering the property.

1 metre social distancing will be maintained as far as is practicable throughout the assessment.

If anthropometric (body and equipment dimensions) data is required, the face shield will be worn.

If there are any safety concerns by the assessor or the client, either will have the right to cease the assessment immediately and these can be raised after the event via email or telephone.

After the assessment:

The assessor will provide a comprehensive written report to the client.
